**SUBJECT:** STATUTE. Interallied Confederation of Reserve Officers (CIOR) Badge.

**AIM:** Harmonize the use and wearing of CIOR insignia.

**GENERAL:** The Interallied Confederation of Reserve Officers Badge is a symbol of unity of the Member Nations and continuation of the organisation.

There are two types of Badges: Regular Badge and Honorary Member's Badge.

Regular Badge can be worn by all past and present CIOR delegates

Honorary Member's Badge can only be worn by CIOR Honorary Members:  
past Presidents and past Secretary Generals



### **Article 1 – Purpose of the CIOR Badge**

- 1.1 The Interallied Confederation of Reserve Officers (CIOR) Badge is a symbol of unity of the Member Nations and continuation of the organisation.
- 1.2 There are two types of Badges:
  - 1) The Regular Badge
  - 2) The Honorary Member's Badge
- 1.3 The Honorary Member's Badge aims to recognise the significant contribution of those officers who taken on the challenge and responsibility to lead a large and international organization that CIOR is in the pursuit of its objectives.

### **Article 2 – The right to wear and wearing the Badge**

- 2.1 The Honorary Member's Badge can only be worn by CIOR Honorary Members.
- 2.2 The Regular Badge can be worn by all past and present CIOR delegates.
- 2.3 Both Badges are to be worn on service dress uniform on the left hand side of the chest but in accordance with the national regulations of individual wearers uniform rules.
- 2.4 The Regular Badge can be worn either on a leather base that is attached to the button of the uniforms jacked pocket or without the leather base and pinned straight to the uniform jacket.
- 2.5 The Honorary Member's Badge is worn only without the leather base pinned straight to the uniform jacket.

### **Article 3 - Issuance**

- 3.1 The Regular Badge is available to purchase by CIOR delegates.
- 3.2 The Honorary Member's Badge is not widely available to purchase, only Honorary Members can acquired it from the Presidency.
- 3.3 The Regular Badge can be donated as a gift by the President or Council.

### **Article 4 - Design of the Regular Badge**

- 4.1 The Regular Badge is a CIOR crest that is made of two parts: the base and the top.
- 4.2 The base is 29.0 mm wide, 38.0 mm long and 2.0 mm thick blue hard enameled plate with a golden edge. On the top golden edge there is a red hard enameled inscription

“CIOR”. Underneath the plate, extending over the top and bottom edge, there is a gold plated embossed sword 52.8 mm in length.

- 4.3 The top is 26.0 mm and 1.5 mm thick gold plated and blue hard enameled NATO star that is mounted centrally on a globe.
- 4.4 The top is mounted on the base and the top part is polished.

### Article 5 – Design of the Honorary Member’s Badge

- 5.1 The Honorary Member’s Badge is a Regular Badge that is surrounded by a golden wreath.
- 5.2 The wreath is 41.2 mm wide and 47.3 mm long gold plated embossed oak and olive leaf wreath, with oak branch on the right side and a laurel branch on the left side.
